It is a nice out-and-back hiking trail suitable for the whole family with lots of great southern California scenery and photo opportunities.
IE - San Antonio Heights	Rancho Cucamonga Creek Trail	875 Cucamonga Creek Trail, Upland, CA 91784	9.2 miles	Parking available on Euclid Ave and 24th St.	Cross Cucamonga Canyon (Creek) and take in the beautiful scenery
IE - Coachella Valley	Indian Canyons and Palm Canyon Trails—Murray Canyon	38520 S Palm Canyon Dr, Palm Springs, CA 92264		On-site parking—\$9 for adults, \$6 for children, \$7 for seniors and students	Murray Canyon Trail is well known for ending at the Seven Sisters Waterfall. On the way back from enjoying the waterfall, take a right at the Coffman Trail junction. Coffman will loop through the desert floor and go left to head back to Murray Canyon. While you are here, enjoy the other trails this location has to offer.
