



HAM RADIO OPERATOR TASK DESCRIPTION (SAG)

6:30am - 4:00pm daily

(ending time may be earlier depending on day/weather/route)

LOCATIONS + ASSIGNMENT TIMES:

Friday, June 14 - Report to volunteer position at 6:30am

SAG vehicle volunteers will stage at Thomas Point Beach in the morning and provide route support on the way to Bates College.

Saturday, June 15 - Report to volunteer position at 6:30am

SAG vehicle volunteers will stage at Bates College in the morning and provide route support on the way to St. Joseph's College.

Sunday, June 16 - Report to volunteer position at 6:30am

SAG vehicle volunteers will stage at St. Joseph's College in the morning and provide route support on the way to Thomas Point Beach.

ASSIGNMENT DETAILS:

Ham Radio Operators are the main form of communication between route based volunteers and the finish line during Trek weekend. You will provide updates and information on the status of cyclists, rest stops, and other SAG vehicles via your radio. You will ride along with your assigned SAG vehicle for the duration of Trek weekend.

SAG vehicles will be equipped with a bike rack to transport cyclists and their bike forward to the next rest stop for mechanical or medical assistance as needed. Additional supplies (including a cooler, ice, bike pump, sunscreen, etc.) will also be provided.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

- Overnight housing (dorm bed) is provided for each Ham Radio Operator. You will also receive a commemorative t-shirt and meals for the duration of the weekend.
- The SAG and Ham Radio Operator volunteer crews generally meet on Thursday evening prior to the Trek to discuss weekend plans and assignment details. Information regarding this meeting will be shared with you by your volunteer lead.
